Guide for Interpreting Course Evaluation Reports

The green numbers indicate the scale that students see when filling out the evaluation. They are added here for clarity.

Positive numbers indicate students agree with the statement and negative numbers indicate they disagree with the statement.

2 = Strongly Agree -2 = Strongly Disagree 1 = Agree -1 = Disagree 0 = Neutral The red numbers indicate the number of students who marked that rating.

The purple numbers indicate the percentage of students who marked that rating.

The mean is the average of the ratings. In this case,
