

SUMMARY

At the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, Archives & Special Collections, like other repositories across the globe, moved its services online, increased its digitizing program, created robust streaming classrooms, generated videos, and held remote research and instruction sessions in partnership with faculty and researchers.

Archives & Special Collections continues to provide informed and collaborative services for all, creating welcoming informal learning spaces, online and onsite, where researchers expand their experience, knowledge, and perspective by connecting with primary materials.

The insights gained in 2020 have given rise to additional ways in which students and researchers can interact with collections. These new methods will continue to play an important role in primary research into the future, offering new avenues for exploration, teaching, and investigation.
