



Fall Enrollment Trends Since 2011- All Students




Fall 2019-2023 Enrollment Trends- By Program





Fall 2019-2023 Enrollment Trends- By Student Classification







P.28 Key Definitions and Terms

Key Definitions and Terms

- **Census Date:** 21st day of term or at close of last day of drop.
- Class Sections: In this reporting, the Common Data Set definition is used in class section reporting. A class section is an organized course offered for credit, identified by discipline and number, meeting at a stated time or times in a classroom or similar setting, and not a subsection such as a laboratory or discussion session. Undergraduate class sections are defined as any sections in which at least one degree-seeking undergraduate student is enrolled for credit. Exclude distance learning classes and noncredit classes and individual instruction such as dissertation or thesis research, music instruction, or one-to-one readings. Exclude students in independent study, co-operative programs, internships, foreign language taped tutor sessions, practicums, and all students in one-on-one classes
- **First-Time Full-Time (FTFT)**: A degree-seeking student who is enrolling for the first time at any institution of higher education and has enrolled in 12 or more credit hours in their first Fall semester.
- FTFT Cohort: The first fall semester in which a degree-seeking student enrolled for the first time at Columbia College Chicago.
- **Graduating Student Employment Outcomes**: Bachelor and graduate degree recipients from Columbia College Chicago are asked to complete an exit survey each fall and spring semester. This survey is intended to capture information on their college experience and an early snapshot of post-graduation outcomes. Actual student employment rates are likely higher, as students are being asked to provide information before their actual graduate date.
- **Graduation:** A student is considered graduated if they received a degree during or prior to the academic year. Example: A Fall 2011 student is identified as a 4-year graduate if they received a degree in Spring 2015 (during their 4th year of enrollment). They will continue to be counted among graduates in subsequent years.
- **IPEDS:** The Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System is a system of interrelated surveys conducted annually by the National Center for Education Statistics, a part of the Institute for Education Sciences within the United States Department of Education. IPEDS has specific definitions for race and ethnicity used in this summary.
- **Retention:** A student is considered retained if they are enrolled on census date of subsequence Fall semesters. Example: A Fall 2011 student is identified as a 1-year retention if they are enrolled on census date of the Fall 2012 term. They are returning to their second academic year.
- **Transfer Full-Time (TRFT):** A degree-seeking student who is enrolling at CCC after attending another institution of higher education and has enrolled in 12 or more credit hours in their first Fall semester.



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
