Theatre Assessment Report AY 2020-21 DRAFT

Summary


During the 2020-21 Academic Year, students were assessed in three courses: a survey in the Foundations course, performance in the Stage Combat three-course sequence, and a quiz in the Musical Theatre Five-Week Foundations course.


I. Assessment 1: Foundations Student Survey

Method

During the Fall 2020 semester, a brief survey was created to be administered to all eight sections of the Theatre Foundations course. A total of 56 students completed the survey. It should be noted that CFAC leadership contacted part-time faculty teaching these sections and advised them not to administer the survey, thus the response rate was less than it might have been otherwise.

Results





The final three questions were open-ended. Themes from the student comments were:¹

3. What do you think is going well so far this semester?

- Making good connections and collaborating with other students and teachers in the class
- Learning and understanding the material/concepts

4. What do you think is not going well so far this semester?

- Not enough time spent learning about the performing side of theatre. Most time spent with design.
- Heavy workload that involves too many small assignments
- Difficult class to do over zoom

5. What, if anything, would you change about this class?

- More of a balance between learning about design and performing sides of theatre
- The pandemic being over and the class being fully in person
- Less workload


Other Trend Comments

- Communication could be better between professors and student (ex. assignment due dates, grades, projects, expectations)
- Shorter class time or incorporate breaks
- Course material is too much at a beginner level


II. Assessment 2: Stage Combat Assessment

Method

During the Fall 2020 semester, all sections of the three-level sequence of Stage Combat were assessed. Students were assessed on key stage combat assignments by teaching faculty the same rubric. As opposed to live, in-class assessment (pre-Pandemic), students recorded their performances, and these recorded sessions were reviewed and assessed by faculty.

Highest Student Performance

- 1. Story,
- 2. Footwork

Lowest Student Peformance

- 1. Defense
- 2. Offense

There was a debrief on the results with David Wooley, Stage Combat Coordinator. He shared the following observations:

"In terms of their offense and defense [lower scores], it's not going down so drastically that it makes me go, 'Hmm.' It makes me go, 'It's a harder weapon and you need to work harder to make it part of your thing.'"

"The goal really is to get the basics in that [lower level] class to be really strong and try to get the understanding of the basic concepts as strong as possible. I'm not surprised to see the [lower level] higher than the [upper level] when we're working that way. The three-hundred level also end up really spreading out so that you'll see the cream rise to the top."

"But if you look at the storytelling, [it] gets stronger. I think we see the footwork getting better. Offensive and defense, it just gets harder to do when you're using the advanced weapons, that's all. But the breath and vocal gets better. It does make me go, 'Need to work breath and vocal even more.' That work needs to continually be beaten into them. And I think we also may be more critical when we're looking at offense and defense and using the weapons."

"One of the interesting things about teaching at home is that we're able to look a little bit more in the technicalities of how things are going. But spatially, students fighting in their living rooms, I only see them from the waist up because they don't have enough room to actually walk. I had a student yesterday whose brain melted, because while she was trying to do class, her little brother and little sister were watching cartoons in the same space. So difficult to just even pay attention much less pretend to sword fight."

III. Assessment 3: Musical Theatre Final Week (Week 5) Quiz

Method

To guage student knowledge of basic musical theatre history and concepts, students were given a twenty-three item quiz at the end of the Five-Week Muscial Theatre Foundations course (THEA 141). There were 14 Multiple Choice questions that broadly covered *musical theatre performance* and 9 Short Answer questions that covered *musical theatre making*.

4. What do you think is not going well so far this semester?

Even when I've tried to step back and really let others have a voice, we get off track and mess around and my grades have suffered. I also do not feel like our instructors aren't trying enough to teach us. Our curriculum is for kindergartners honestly. We frolicked in the park and made collage boxes. Like what in the hell does that have to do with theater and the art of theater making? I usually find it really easy to draw parallels between unconventional exercises and art, but I could not-for the life of me- figure out why we were learning some of the things we did.

I miss being in person, its so much easier to learn about acting when you can actually act. And yes we do something with zoom, and thats alright, its just hard.

What do you think is not going well so far this semester?

Our professors ignore our needs. We come together and express our concerns with how they run the class and disrespect us, and we're met with gaslighting and accusations that we are ganging up on them. There is absolutely zero empathy coming from teachers to students, and it's affecting our motivation and will to learn.

It is very devastating, especially for out of state students like me that is so passionate about selfimprovement and their goals within their field to attend a school that shows little effort and care. My theatre foundation making class, has to be my most disappointing class ever.

Some things not going so well this semester are more so along the lines of formatting. I felt like this entire semester was kind of jumbled in terms of organization of assignments and projects. We as students are held to expectation of accounting for the time it may take to figure out a performance online vs an in-person setting, and if there is a complication, to communicate it to the teacher in enough time to still turn the assignment in on time. So while I understand that this is a new learning

environment for everyone, including teachers, they should also be held to the expectation of accounting for the possible complications that may arise when uploading or posting assignments. And- if a complication does arise, for example if you happen to forget to click the "post" button on the assignment, I would at least expect there to be an extension on the assignment. Especially if the mistake is something out of student control. I think there needs to be a myriad of adjustments for this class as we continue forward with online schooling. Whatever communication teachers and students put in in a normal class setting, needs to be doubled in an online setting. Overall, I think this class was very much a trial run for zoom, so the expectations are a lot different, but at the end of the day I'm still paying 20,000 dollars to go here and I expect for my teachers to be holding themselves to the expectations they hold their students.

The professors of my class don't communicate with each other about their lessons/assignments & it shows. It makes working on these projects very difficult because they'll change one or more aspects of the assignment to accommodate the other. They also have a habit of giving us small details about the assignment without briefing us on the assignment itself, so it's hard to make decisions for that project because we have so little information. As for the performance side of this class, I feel like we're mostly doing the same/similar exercises in the beginning of the year & I'm not quite sure what I'm supposed to be taking away from them ??

The Communication between Professors and students. The professors seemed to dislike teaching the class and it almost felt like they didn't want to listen.

Grading

It's extremely repetitive and I don't believe the class works on the strengths of the students. Additionally, the professors say some offhanded things that are genuinely hurtful/negative. Theres more 'making fun' than there is constructive criticism, its demeaning and doesn't create a space where students feel comfortable coming to their professors.

5. What, if anything, would you change about this class?

I would definitely change the balance of learning about the performance side of theater and the design part of theater. I came to this class hoping to learn more about what happens in lighting, costumes, set design, etc. If I wanted another drama class, I would have taken one

I think we should be taught more about how performers use their voice and space and take on influences, rather than how to flail their arms around and scream out letter sounds for four months. I understand the intention, but the execution is extremely poor.
